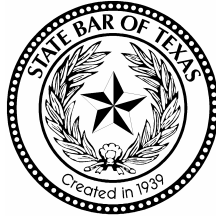

Labor & Employment Law Internship Program 2007

Program Overview

The Labor and Employment Law Section of the State Bar of Texas will provide two stipends with a total value of \$4,000 each to two Texas law students who spend the summer of 2007 working on labor and employment issues at a legal aid, pro bono or other such non-profit legal services organization or program in Texas. Through the internships, the Section expects law students to receive hands-on training in labor and employment law while having a positive impact on the clients they serve. The internships will enable law students to earn a stipend while working with nonprofit organizations that provide access to justice for low-income Texans. The Section prefers to fund internships for projects in which student interns primarily provide direct legal services to low-income clients. However, community outreach and education components will be considered.

To be considered for an internship, your organization must:

1. Develop a summer internship that provides the student a minimum of 40 hours/week for ten weeks working on legal issues related to labor and employment.
2. Complete and submit the attached application to the address on the application.

If your organization is selected to receive an internship, you must:

1. Recruit a law student in good academic standing **from an accredited law school in Texas** as your labor and employment intern and provide the student with the details of the internship, including the nature of the internship, Section sponsorship, amount of the stipend, minimum time commitment, and final report requirement.
2. Provide the Section with the name of the student and the name of the law school the student attends.

After receiving the funding for the internship, the host organization must:

1. Provide adequate supervision for the intern by a licensed attorney in good standing with the licensing authority.
2. Utilize all the funding received from the Section to provide compensation or a stipend for the student intern.
3. Ensure that the student provides to the Section at the end of the internship a final report summarizing the internship experience

Please submit your application no later than **November 15, 2006**. Host organizations will be

selected by **December 1, 2006**, so that the organization will have sufficient recruiting time.
